KS1 and 2: Unity

Starter

Introduce the Bahá'í Faith. Bahá'ís are followers of Bahá'u'lláh.

Song: "We are drops of one ocean"

[whole class: 5-10 mins]

Discussion

Explain who Bahá'ís are.

Bahá'ís believe that there is only one God and that "the earth is one country and mankind its citizens".

Discuss the term "unity". Where else have you heard this word? Examples of unity vs uniformity. Why is diversity important? (Teacher could show a bunch of flowers all the same, and another bunch of varied flowers. Which is more beautiful, and why?)

KS2:

Explain the use of metaphor in the song. What is a metaphor? ("a word or phrase used to describe something as if it were something else"). Children to come up with other metaphors for unity – write them on whiteboard, and discuss why they are good metaphors.

[whole class: 15 minutes]

Main Task

Children to decorate leaves and attach them to a tree (or flowers in a garden). Use colours; put your name on.


