## The Bahá'í bicentenary

Bahá'u'lláh, the Founder of the Bahá'í Faith, was born in Tehran in 1817. Two centuries later, Bahá'ís around the world are celebrating the day of his birth and the birth of the forerunner of his Revelation, the Báb, born in 1819. Bahá'u'lláh taught that religions are from the same source, and that the peoples of the world should come together and work towards unity.
